How we are made right before God is called "Justification". It is the dividing line between the Biblical Gospel of Salvation by faith alone and all the false gospels of salvation based on good works.

"Justify" is the Gk word (dikaio) which has 2 basic meanings:

- 1 Declare you righteous
- 2 Show your righteousness

Justification is:

• A gift (like faith is)

See Eph. 2:8-9, Romans 3:23-24

- It comes after faith Romans 3:26
- Results in peace with God Romans 5:1
- Has nothing to do with our works Romans 3:28;
 Gal. 2:16

Problem: see James 2:24

Answer: James use the word differently than Paul does.

Paul = declares you to be righteous James = Shows you to be righteous

Examples:

Luke 16:15 James 2:21

So Justification is...

An instantaneous legal declaration in which God declares my sins forgiven, imputes Jesus Christ's righteousness to me, and now considers me righteous in His sight.

Why is it Important?

- 1. Reminds me of the sacrifice Jesus made for me
- 2. Reminds me of my need for His work
- 3. Reminds me that God has in fact changed me by faith
- 4. Reminds me that my past has been removed
- 5. Reminds me that I will not be judged on my merits
- 6. Reminds me to be thankful
